Types

Lichen Planopilaris (LPP), Frontal Fibrosing Alopecia (FFA), Central Centrifugal Cicatricial Alopecia (CCCA), Folliculitis Decalvans, Discoid Lupus Erythematosus, Dissecting Cellulitis
Cicatricial (scarring, inflammatory, permanent) alopecia refers to a group of rare disorders that destroy the hair follicle and replace it with scar tissue, thereby causing permanent hair loss.

Causes

Unknown, but may be hereditary. FFA may have an environmental trigger.

Treatment and Care of Condition

Topical steroids or steroid injections into the scalp, oral medications to suppress T-cells, Rogaine, finasteride or dutasteride.
